



BURGUNDY AND 'S WINES

Pommard, Montrachet, Vosne-Romanée, Pouilly-Fumé... no need for translations. The names of these famous crus resonate with wine lovers across the whole world, and they will be enthralled to discover the birthplace of these wines in Burgundy, where the work begun by Cistercian monks in the Middle Ages is being continued. The latter began producing altar wine, before extending the production areas for commercial purposes.

commercial purposes. In autumn, during grape picking season, the ritual has remained the same and the rows of vines become a hive of activity: the bunches of grapes are delicately picked to produce, a few months later, exceptional wines. The red wines are mainly produced from a variety of pinot noir, whereas the white wines use chardonnay grapes. Strength, power, purity, fruity aromas... every wine has its own character, making up the great diversity within the family of Burgundy wines. Did you know...? Chardonnay is also a Burgundy village where Chardonnay Day is celebrated every year: a delicious event which is also shared by American people fond of Burgundian wines.

In order to promote better understanding of them, winemakers open up their vineyards for guided tasting sessions: you only need to follow the five dedicated itineraries, one of which is the legendary *Route des Grands Crus*, 60 kilometres long, connecting Dijon to Santenay; its 80th year of existence was celebrated in 2017.

CHARDONNAY DAY ...

There are a lot of special 'Days' in the year... But this one has a special flavour, in every sense of the word. Created around 10 years ago in the United States, Chardonnay Day celebrates the "cépage" (wine variety) that is exported all over the world. But let's get back to its origins. Chardonnay is also the birthplace of the wine, a village located between Chalon-sur-Saône and Mâcon. Chablis, côtes de Nuits côtes de Boauna, wo'vo loct count sur-Saöne and Macon. Chablis, côtes de Nuits, côtes de Beaune... we've lost count of the exceptional white wines that have come out of Chardonnay. So, what could be more natural than to celebrate Chardonnay Day in Burgundy? Every year, in May, the winegrowers welcome epicurean visitors for wine tastings and visits, in a festive and musical atmosphere.





5 THINGS THAT PROVE YOU HAVE COMETOBURGUNDY AND LOVED IT

You have a souvenir glass from the Saint-Vincent Tournante: every year at the end of January, Burgundians celebrate the patron saint of vintners throughout a big weekend of festivities and tastings. A different wine-producing village plays host to the many visitors every year. The 75th edition will take place in Vézelay in 2019.

2 YOU AREN'T SURPRISED TO HEAR "LE BAN BOURGUIGNON": AT FIRST, YOU MAY FIND THIS A BIT ODD, BUT THE CHORUS AND THE TYPICAL ACTIONS WHICH GO WITH IT ARE SYNONYMOUS WITH FESTIVITIES AND CELEBRATIONS IN ALL BURGUNDIAN FAMILIES. LALA-LALA-LALALALALERE!

Your t-shirt is stained purple: because you have had the unique experience of participating in the grape picking. Picking grapes is sometimes a difficult job, but what a source of pride to think that the new vintage will soon be ready to drink. Another unforgettable moment: la paulée, the big meal which is held to celebrate the end of wine picking in every winery.

4 You have a friend who is a knight. A knight (or chevalier) of the Tastevin, a member of one of the most famous Orders who celebrate the wines of Burgundy. Their headquarter: the elegant chateau of Le Clos de Yougeot. Many Bacchic and gastronomical orders still exist in Burgundy.

5 YOU CAN'T CHOOSE BETWEEN A CI-TROEN DS, A VINTAGE ROLLS ROYCE, A 2CV OR AN HARLEY DAVIDSON: A MUST FOR TRAVELLING ALONG TYPICAL BUR-GUNDIAN ROADS BETWEEN VINES AND VILLAGES. ANOTHER GREAT OPPORTU-NITY TO MEET OTHER ENTHUSIASTS IS THE DURING THE MANY VINTAGE CAR RALLIES ORGANISED THROUGHOUT THE REGION.


RED WINE FROM BURGUNDY HAS ALWAYS BEEN PRODUCED USING PINOT NOIR GRAPES

1/ UNIQUE IN THE HEART OF THE CLIMATS, TERROIRS OF BURGUNDY


The excellence of the wines produced

The region's most recent addition, the Climats, terroirs of Burgundy, obtained UNESCO World Heritage classification in 2015. Every wine which is produced in a Climat, and therefore a certain area or terroir, has its own individual taste. There are exactly 1247 Climats which come one after another along a narrow strip of territory running from Dijon to the Maranges, south of Beaune; among them, there are some famous names, like Chambertin, Romanée-Conti, Clos de Vougeot and Montrachet... A spectacular sight in the autumn: this mosaic of vines is adorned with golden reflections, the hillside "catches fire".

2/ GRANDIOSE AT LA CHARITÉ-SUR-LOIRE

The veritable heart of the historical town, the Priory in La Charité-sur-Loire is well known for its unusual size - the Notre-Dame church is almost 120 metres in length! Today, the site is home to many treasures and a major restoration project in order to protect it. On the outside, the chevet is highly impressive with its Roman arches and the richness of its sculpted decors. Inside, your eyes will instinctively look upwards to admire the architecture, bathed in the softened light which passes through the stained-glass windows. Many pilgrimages stop here, and it was then classified as part of the Way of Saint James of Compostela by UNESCO.





3/ BREATHTAKING IN VÉZELAY

The panorama from the parvis of the basilica

Having held UNESCO World Heritage classification for 40 years in 2019, the Sainte-Madeleine basilica in Vézelay sits atop what is known as the Eternal Hill. A gentle promontory from which the Burgundian countryside provides a 100% natural view with Morvan, its hills and forests. After the stunning view, time to take a closer look: the church's stunning and well-preserved Roman architecture, notably its gateway and its sculpted capitals. A last detour before going back to the nearby vineyard will let you discover a refined white wine.

4/ MARVEL AT FONTENAY ABBEY: PEACE RADIATES FROM THE CLOISTER

The serenity emanating from the cloister

You will easily be able to imagine the monks going from arch to arch, savouring the peace and quiet of this site. Fontenay Abbey obtained World Heritage status in 1981 and it was founded in 1118 by Saint Bernard of Clairvaux. Its simple yet majestic architecture can only impress visitors, who can wander from the church to the refectory via what used to be the forge. The way the site is organised is typical of the design of Cistercian abbeys and served as an inspiration for many communities in subsequent years. Particular mention should be made of the abbey gardens which are geometrical, elegant and immaculate, a place where you can take time out to meditate in the shade of the 200-year old plane tree. In 2018, the abbey has also celebrated its 900th anniversary.



BURGUNDY HAS MANY VILLAGES...

... and cities which are full of character, where visitors can enjoy a stroll, seeing every corner of every street offer up new delights and treasures.

THE MOST MEDIEVAL: Châteauneuf-en-Auxois and its medieval fortress overlooking the Canal de Bourgogne.

THE MOST NOSTALGIC:

Flavigny-sur-Ozerain with the gentle perfume of aniseed enveloping the village. Head to the workshop to choose your flavours. Immerse yourself in the world of *Chocolat*, the film with Juliette Binoche and Johnny Depp which was filmed here.

WE LOVE TOURNUS FOR... its gastronomy. The town has 4 starred chefs but only 6,200 inhabitants, each and every one an epicurean! The historic heart of the city, the Saint-Philibert abbey celebrates 1000 years in 2019.

THE MOST ARTISTIC:

Noyers-sur-Serein, a genuine movie set, has created real harmony between its half-timbered houses and contemporary art galleries.



>> FOR THOSE WHO WANT TO MAKE SURE

THEY SEE ABSOLUTELY EVERYTHING

The name of this 800km circuit tells the whole story, made up of 6 itineraries including the Canal du Nivernais which runs along the water front or the *Voie des Vignes* which runs alongside the *Route des Grands Crus*. Some sections use the EuroVelo 6 which links the Black Sea to the Atlantic Ocean, letting you see more!



You will definitely need to wear a helmet for this 330km itinerary: in the heart of Morvan, you will travel up hill and down dale, to the delight of those with a taste for sport and who are ready to rush along these tracks amid a natural setting. Forests, lakes, granitic rocks...

>>FOR A JOURNEY THROUGH TIME

Renaissance chateaux, Cistercian abbey, legendary site of the Battle of Alesia...: on the banks of the Canal de Bourgogne, you can relive history in 3D as your boat sails along peacefully! The Canal du Nivernais is a much more wild and natural setting and it will lead you through a landscape which contains hints of the Amazon jungle.

<u>TAKE A WALK UP</u> <u>THE ROCHE DE</u> SOLUTRÉ ON FOOT

>> FOR FANTASTIC PANORAMIC VIEWS

In the department of Saône-et-Loire, the top of the Roche de Solutré is 495 metres above sea level: a site which rises from the centre of the vineyards and is classified as a "Grand Site de France". It can be explored thanks to various marked hiking trails.

FOR HIKING, DON'T MISS:

As true epicureans, people from Burgundy often combine physical activities with delicious food.

So, try doing the same as them and take a Burgundystyle picnic: a slice of *jambon persillé*, a generous piece of local cheese along with some bread... perfect for recharging the batteries!

<u>THE</u> SAÔNE

Go along the Saône on the Moselle, a soothing route which follows beautiful natural and historical stops.

THE LOIRE

>> TO EXPLORE ONE OF THE LAST WILD RIVERS IN EUROPE

Whether you are in a canoe or a kayak, or out for a sunset cruise, the flora and fauna of the Loire are there in front of your very eyes - an incredible sight.

FOR BOATS, DON'T MISS:

there is plenty of sea surrounding France... but that's not the only water!

Burgundy has one of the biggest networks of rivers and canals in France, with more than 1200 kilometres of waterways. Take control by driving a rental boat or use a hotel barge and don't worry about anything.

BON APPÉTIT

BOEUF BOL

SO DELICIOUS

Recipe: a revamped classic, left as a legacy by the great Chef at the famous Relais Bernard Loiseau in Saulieu.

Prepare the marinade 24 hours beforehand. In a stainless-steel saucepan, bring the red wine to the boil and set it alight. Then allow to cool completely.

Meanwhile, peel the carrots and the large onions. Chop them coarsely. Prepare the meat (if necessary) and cut it into pieces of approximately 70g (3-4cm cubes).

Put the carrots, onions and meat into a deep dish. Cover the ingredients with wine and place the dish in the refrigerator for 24 hours.

Cook the boeuf bourguignon. Strain the meat and the vegetables separately. Collect up the wine. Heat 3 tablespoons of oil in an ovenproof casserole dish and brown the meat in it for 5 min. Season with salt and ground pepper. Then add the garnish of marinated vegetables. Allow to cook for 4 more minutes.

Prepare the aromatic garnish (while the beef is cooking). Peel, wash and "glaze" the button onions: place them in a saucepan with 20g of butter and entirely cover them with water. Add the 1/2 tablespoon of caster sugar. Cover with baking paper cut into a circle (matching the diameter of the saucepan). Bring to the boil and allow to reduce over medium heat. When the water has evaporated, remove the sheet of baking paper and brown the onions in the remaining butter and sugar to caramelise them. Season them with salt and pepper when they have finished cooking.

INGREDIENTS

1.8kg chuck steak 200g carrot 200g button mushrooms 200g semi-salted belly pork 2 cloves of garlic 20g butter Bouquet garni 1 litre of red Burgundy wine 10cl oil 1/2 tablespoon of caster sugar 200g button onions Ground pepper/Salt 3 tablespoons balsamic vinegar 2 onions

Add the balsamic vinegar and allow it to fully reduce. Put aside the glazed (i.e. covered with a shiny film) button onions. Remove the rind and cartilage from the semi-salted belly pork. Cut into lardons. Blanch these lardons, i.e. put them into boiling water and boil for 1 min. Heat 1 tablespoon of oil in a frying pan to fry the lardons. When they are nicely browned, place them onto some kitchen roll to absorb the fat.

Peel and wash the button mushrooms. Drain them and cut them into quarters. Fry them with 1 tablespoon of oil in a frying pan. Season them when they have finished cooking then place on kitchen roll to soak up the fat.

Reheat the boeuf bourguignon one last time on a high heat. Add the lardons and mushrooms, in addition to the button onions. Serve very hot in a deep dish, along with some mashed potatoes or a pasta bake.


